

6 Anthropology

Anthropology is the study of what makes us human. Anthropologists think broadly about human experience including how humans lived thousands of years ago and what they relied on. They consider physical bodies, as well as our bones, diet, health, and **evolutionary** influences. Anthropologists also compare humans with other animals, especially other **primates** like monkeys and chimpanzees to see what we have in common with them and what makes us unique. Even though all humans need food, water, shelter and companionship to survive, the ways cultures and **civilizations** meet these needs can be very different. Anthropologists also consider social relationships, dress, customs, and communication in societies.
