3 Charles Darwin

Charles Darwin was born in 1809. His father was a well-known doctor; his mother died when Charles was eight. Darwin's grandfather often discussed his ideas about **evolution** with Charles. As a child, Charles was not inspired by school. He liked to collect **beetles**, ride horses and hunt animals. In the summer of 1825 he studied to become a doctor but couldn't continue. Darwin found the lectures boring, hated watching surgery, and couldn't stand to see **blood**. His life changed after going on the HMS Beagle's five year **research** trip to the Galápagos Islands. Later as a scientist, he wrote books about coral reefs, reptiles, fossils, insects, climbing plants and other scientific topics. Because he was a careful man, and because he expected criticism from Christians, Darwin waited a long time to **publish** his theory of evolution. Finally, when Alfred Russel Wallace sent him an essay that also explained evolution, they published their ideas together.


