He could have been executed, or worse, but he cooperated by lying, saying the Church's teachings are true. Thus, he lived under "house arrest" rather than in prison. During his time under house arrest he wrote great science books. Galileo's **inventions** and careful **observations** of the natural world **revolutionized** science.
